Sacrament of Marriage

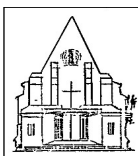

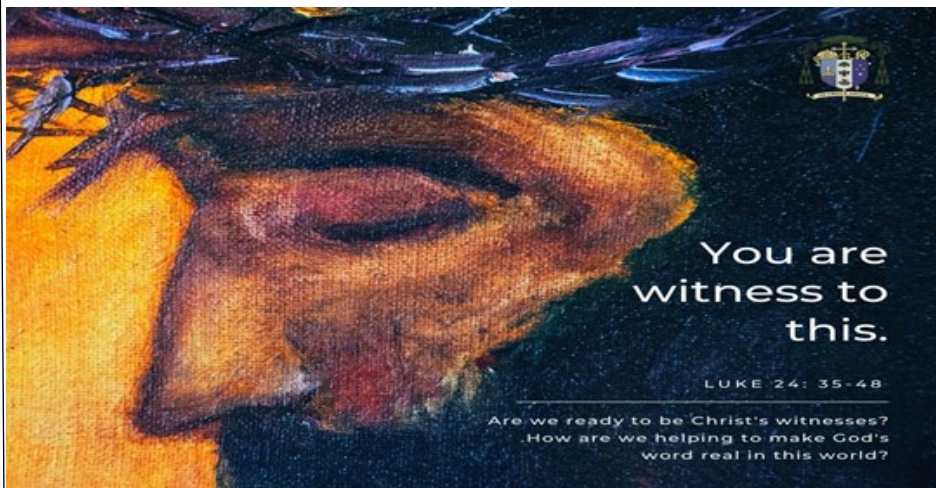
